This State Achievement Award recipient is described as compassionate and caring, making guests feel welcome at chapter meetings and serving as a mentor for all. She keeps her chapter up to date with all things DKG by guiding, suggesting, reminding, and encouraging. Inducted into DKG in 1983, her attention to detail and vast knowledge of the Society are great assets to her chapter and to her volunteer work at TSO Headquarters.

Having served in most chapter offices and on many chapter committees, she has received her chapter's achievement award twice and often presents programs on topics such as heart health, caregiving, membership growth, Schools for Africa, and ASTEF. Yearbooks, newsletters, and research are



among her specialties, with her yearbooks consistently earning Early Bird and Exemplary awards.

She has regularly attended area workshops, serving as a breakout session presenter many times; and as area coordinator, she undertook the tremendous responsibility of organizing the 2020 area workshop by Zoom.

Her state involvement includes having served on five state committees and chairing the Headquarters committee. In addition, she served as Secretary of the 2005 Dallas Convention Steering Committee, Publicist for the 2016 Frisco Convention, and Annie's Attic sales organizer at the 2019 Arlington Convention; and she has attended nearly every state convention since 1996, often serving as a presenter.

On the International level, she has attended seven conferences and conventions, and her essays and poems have been published multiple times in the online DKG Art Gallery.




chapters statewide and catching up with conversations and hugs—and meeting new people and hearing about their lives and their part of our state.

Money, Numbers, and Other Info

- 2022 ASTEF Project Stipends: A total of \$14,282 was awarded to 13 chapters for their projects.
- Delta Omicron members donated \$190 in gift cards (photo on right) to the convention's Unifying Project, Shelby's Bridge.
 The total contributed by all chapters was \$5,685.
- At the Presidents and Founders Banquet, attendees donated
 - \$3,134.75 to our DKGIEF (Delta Kappa Gamma International Educators Foundation; FYI, \$2,719.75 of this \$3,134.75 is dedicated to the Emergency Fund to help members with a major loss due to a natural disaster) and
 - \$5,361 to assist those impacted by the shooting at Uvalde's Robb Elementary School.



- DKG's Texas State Organization has 227 chapters with a total membership of 6,296.
- A total of 653 members attended the Lubbock Convention, including the presidents of 128 chapters.
- Three kinds of breakout sessions are offered at conventions: Society Business, Special Interests, and Continuing Professional Education.
