Minutes: Members approved the January and February minutes as printed in the chapter newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Leesa Cole

- (1) Please pay \$100 to Leesa for 2019-2020 membership dues by the May meeting. We do not want to lose members over money.
- (2) \$4,867.30 is our balance. Some of this amount is temporary because it will go to next year's dues and the CCDC luncheon.

(3) If you want to attend the CCDC luncheon, tonight is the deadline to give Leesa your \$33 reservation.

New Business:

(1) Schools for Africa: Carolyn Power reported on the 2010 international convention in Seattle when attendees voted to adopt the project working with UNICEF. Marylin Nease shared two examples of what our donations will buy for SFA, for example, \$68 will buy one student desk. Katherine Grogan played a two-minute video about SFA. Lou McMillan and Leesa Cole took up cash donations and gave members who wanted to write a personal check the official donation form to mail in on their own. Members donating at the meeting contributed \$242 to SFA.

(2) CCDC Luncheon: Delta Omicron will provide the "greeters."

Mary White, Katherine Grogan, and Katrina Hallman volunteered. Greeters need to be at Lakewood Country Club at 9 a.m. Other attendees need to be there by 9:30 a.m. The luncheon is always a great gathering. Remember to bring cash or check (no credit cards) for the silent auction.

(3) ASTEF Project Grant Application Report: Thank you to the Hillier Project Committee - Margaret Thompson, Katy Kunofsky, Becky Quigley, Katherine Grogan, Carrie Parsons, and

(4) Chapter Rules Report: Jean Wallace, committee chair, and members Lou Brown and Shirley Kochman are revising the chapter rules to be in alignment with rules changes made at the 2018 international convention in Austin. Thank you so much! If anyone else would like to volunteer for this committee's revision work, they would enjoy your help.

(5) Chapter Vote: Funds for President's Convention Travel, Hotel, and Registration.

The question: Do we want to make funds available to chapter officers to use when the president is unable to attend conferences or conventions?

Katy Kunofsky motioned that we make funds available to the officers to use when they take the place of the president when she is unable to attend a convention or conference.

Becky Quigley seconded the motion.

Lou McMillan called for a vote. Members voted unanimous approval.

Leesa Cole, treasurer, told us we have \$1,500 budgeted for president's convention/conference expenses (travel/hotel/registration) total. It won't cover everything, but it helps a lot with expenses. Any officers may attend the convention/conference in the president's place.

Program: "Being a Caregiver"

Katherine Grogan, 1st Vice President of Projects and Programs, introduced the presenters: **Marta Finlay, Mary Gill**, and **Marylin Nease**.

Mary Gill began with a quote from Rosalyn Carter about the universality of caregiving.

Marta Finlay shared signs of caregiver stress.

Marylin Nease shared seven ways we can take care of ourselves while we are caregivers. (1) Practice mindfulness. (2) Look for humor in every situation. (3) Adjust our perspective. (4) Exercise daily. (5) Take breaks. (6) Stay hydrated and eat healthfully. (7) Sleep well. Sleep tips: To fall asleep, use deep breathing and thinking about five things you are grateful for each night. Use a white noise machine, and turn off your devices an hour or two before bedtime.

Marta Finlay provided info about necessary documents: will, power of attorney, durable power of attorney, living will, and living trust.

Mary Gill ended with respite care information, explaining that respite care is different from providing care for the "caregivee": it is for the caregiver. She suggested getting the *AARP – Prepared to Care* family caregiving planning brochure. She also talked about T Boone Pickens Respite Care in Dallas and about legislative activity related to caregiver respite.

The meeting adjourned, and members sang "The Delta Kappa Gamma Song." ◆

Budgeted expenses include a

\$10 donation to Schools for Africa and

reimbursement to chapter communications chair for postage and supplies. Payments were also made to CCDC for luncheon reservations and Schools for Africa in the donated amount. Dues payments to International and TSO will be made this summer. We send \$40 per member to International and \$20 per member to TSO. Chapter members who attend the TSO convention in Arlington will split a budgeted stipend to defray costs. Upcoming payments may include chapter grant-in-aid, chapter scholarship, and International conference attendance reimbursements.

We have received donation acknowledgements from each of the International entities (paid in January) as well as Schools for Africa.

Dues for 2019-2020 membership are due now.

Send your dues to Leesa Cole ASAP. Pay in full, pay in halves in May and June, but don't delay. Leesa must submit your name as a paid member by June 30 and send money to International and TSO in June and July.

- Dues will be collected each spring instead of the fall.
- This is an International directive from last July's convention.

- It is accompanied by a new online dues reporting system, which will streamline the reporting process.
- International expects payments from chapters in June and July.
- International will email reminders in August and September; then, unpaid members are automatically dropped on October 1.
- To avoid being automatically dropped:
 Pay dues at the May 20 meeting or mail them to
 Leesa Cole.

Remember to **keep your membership card** as International no longer prints these. You can print your own from your My DKG account on the International website.






