"It was a visit I'll always remember." ♦

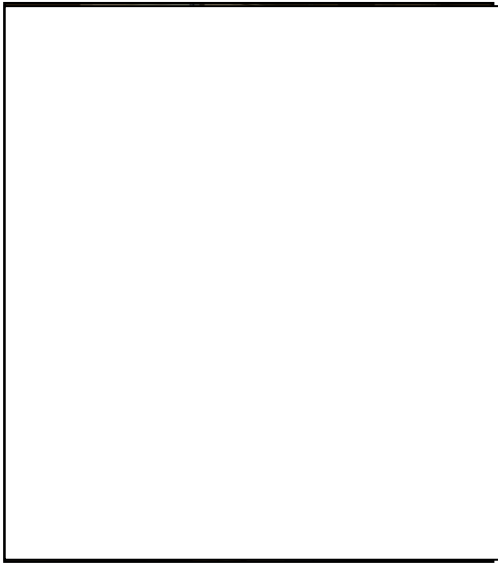




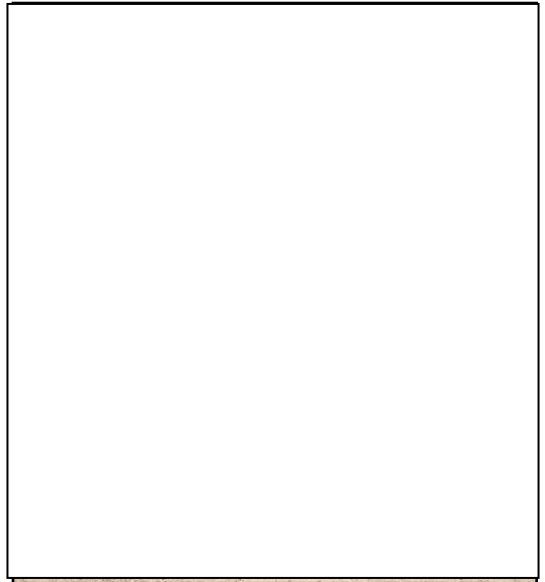

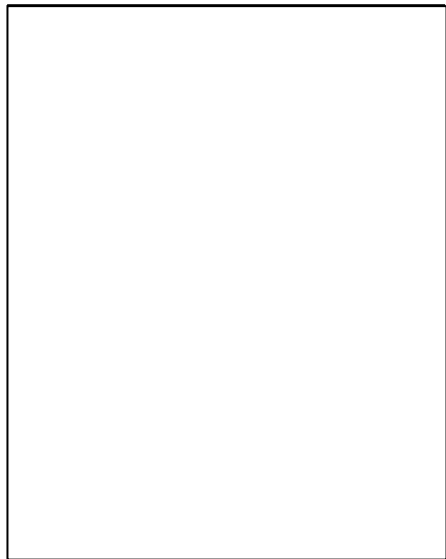

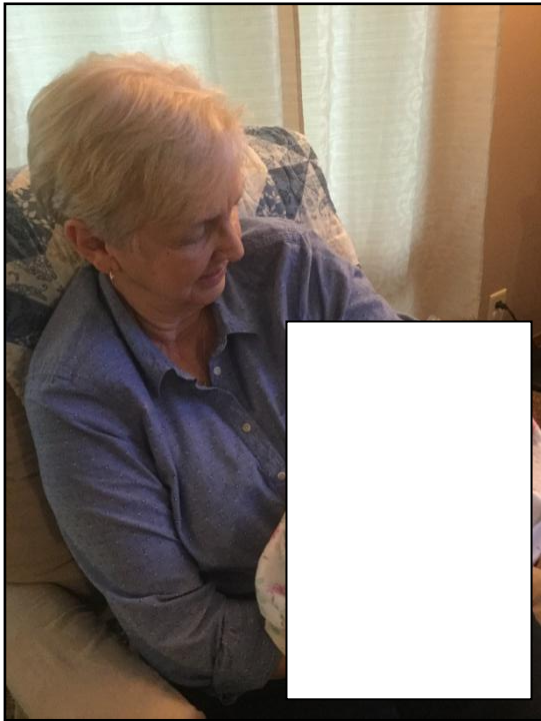
