Welcome to fall, y'all!





The committee recommends the following:

Membership & Dues Payments

- Members joining our chapter with Active status each Sept.-Dec. will pay \$60 dues to International & TSO to establish membership in the Society. Chapter dues of \$40 are waived at this time.
- For these fall members, Delta Omicron will pay to TSO the \$.20 per member scholarship fee + the \$2.50 fee per inductee (this fee does not apply to reinstated or transferred members).
- To renew membership for the following year with Active status, members will pay \$100 no later than May each year.

- The proposed budget, Misc. line item has been increased to \$550 to accommodate these costs no other changes were made to the proposed budget.

Legislation Committee

Two bills have been filed in Washington to change the **Windfall Elimination Provision**. Kevin Brady filed HR 3934, and Richard Neal filed HR 4540. If passed, these bills will create a fairer formula for retirees.

Texas Retirement System (TRS) is conducting **sessions across Texas discussing TRS Care for Medicare and Non-Medicare**. Tim Lee, Executive Director of Texas Retired Teachers System (TRTA), will attend some of these sessions. Webinars will also be provided.

The Texas Retirement System of **Texas (TRS)** is going to lease three floors, which is more than **100,000 square feet**, starting in 2021 from a new building in Austin, the Indeed Tower. The new building will host the TRS investment division.

TRS is not going to release the deals of the lease until a future date. Many educators are concerned about TRS using the Texas Teachers Pension Fund to pay for the new offices. **TRS also has an office in London and has proposed opening an office in Singapore, China.**

TRS, as a state agency, is subject to sunset review during the next legislative session. Keep in touch with your legislators! Many of the legislators are up for re-election!


herself, she told Kay about the tour being worthwhile. Maureen was right!
