What Did You Do in July?

I, along with other incoming ACs and state committee chairs, attended Leadership for State Personnel (LOSP) training in Arlington Monday-Wednesday, July 22-24.

Who were our teachers? Past state presidents, incoming state officers, state employees (executive secretary, treasurer, executive assistant, editor/photographer, webmaster), ASTEF leaders, and other state leaders, all with vast DKG knowledge

and effective leadership skills.

How fortunate we were to have these leaders teach us what we need to know in order for 2019-2021 to be a "forward moving ever," successful biennium!

Three Key Points for 2019-2021

(1) **Membership Growth**—We ALL must recruit, retain, and reinstate members. Be thinking about educators you will invite to membership.

The next "Chapter Membership Snapshot" will be taken March 1 (no longer May 1), so start recruiting now

(2) Area 9 Workshop—Chapter presidents met August 10 to begin planning for our September 19, 2020, workshop.

I have contacted Region 10 about using their facilities but have not received an answer.

I've also asked presidents in Plano, Frisco, and Forney schools to check with their districts so that I can follow up if we need a Plan B.

(3) Reception for Patti Belknap—Our 2019-2021 state president is from Area 9. We Area 9 chapters will host a reception to honor and celebrate Patti as our TSO leader.

Potential dates: March 28 or 29, April 18 or 19.

Lou McMillan, Delta Omicron president, has checked with Park Cities Baptist Church in Dallas about using their parlor. The fee is reasonable; however, they reserve only six months out, so we won't know until October whether we can reserve the parlor. Also, the reception will be on March 28 or April 18 if held at PCBC because the church does not rent its facilities for Sundays. Be thinking of a Plan B.

Without YOU, TSO will not thrive.



She also attended a breakout session titled "Educational Travel for Educators" and loved the teacher-presenters' humor.



Technology, Costa Mesa, California July 17-20, 2019

DKG Technology Conference Costa Mesa, California July 17-20, 2019

Dear Delta Omicron Sisters,

Costa Mesa, California, was fun and friendly. After arriving at John Wayne Airport, I met a DKG acquaintance from the June TSO meeting in Arlington. We took the shuttle to the hotel, checked in, registered, and had lunch. Twice I have attended DKG International meetings by myself, and both times I made many new friends.

There were 217 women at this conference. This may have been the smallest attendance of the five conferences held this summer. I never had to wait for an elevator and always could get into a breakout session.

The major reason I chose to attend this conference was my acceptance of the TSO position of Texas State U. S. Forum Liaison. Having been given a description of what that meant, I decided I needed to know exactly what I really was supposed to be doing. So glad I said yes to this new job. This is causing me to learn lots of new information. I plan to share some of this with our chapter at our October meeting.

At the training I participated in discussions and listened to experts discuss topics such as

- 12 ways your phone is changing you,
- How to keep your common sense when using social media,
- Research showing screen time is addictive,
- How teachers are using robots to teach, and
- Research showing a rise in young adults claiming to be lonely even when they have 250 online friends.

On Thursday night I was one of 150 DKG women who attended a performance of *The Phantom of the Opera* at the Segerstrom Center for the Arts. It was a sold-out crowd of 3,000. Fantastic performance.

I met four DKG women at the Newcomers Conference. These friends were all about 26 years old. They had been DKG members six months.

Thank you to Delta Omicron Chapter for helping pay for this trip. The conference was an inspirational one.

Arts and Humanities Asheville, North Carolina June 27-29, 2019

Three reasons I attended this conference: I like learning new things, the arts and humanities are my cup of tea, and my friend of 50 years lives in nearby Hendersonville.

I invited to attend the conference as my registered guest, and she not only housed



and me but also drove the two of us to the conference each day.

and I attended a variety of workshop sessions, such as presentations about Leonardo da Vinci's painting *The Last Supper*, literature set in the British Isles, reading for the love of reading, and international's Schools for Africa project. International's president, Cathy Daughtery, was the presenter for SfA and is the only DKG member to have traveled to Africa to see firsthand what a difference our joint project with UNICEF is making.



On Friday and I also heard the Humanities Luncheon's keynote speaker, Dr. Kevan Frazier, talk about "all things Asheville." Dr. Frazier is an Asheville native and the Executive Director for Western

Carolina University's Asheville program located at Biltmore Park. He is the founder of Asheville by Foot, a local walking tour business, and the author of *Legendary Locals of Asheville*.

After the luncheon, and I attended the US Forum presentation, which included Dr. Akil Ross, National Principal of the Year, sharing his personal story showing the power a community and educators have to transform a struggling student into a high performing one. A newspaper headline after he was announced as National Principal of the Year summed up his tale this way: "He flunked the third grade. Now he's the best high school principal in the nation."

The fourth and fifth reasons I like attending DKG conventions and conferences: meeting fellow educators and being inspired by presenters.
